AT A GLANCE

The Danish Refugee Council (DRC) has been operating in Bangladesh since 2017, when the first team started providing emergency assistance to the Rohingya population arriving from neighbouring Myanmar. DRC works with the Refugee Relief and Repatriation Commission (RRRC) of the Government of Bangladesh and the Inter Sector Coordination Group (ISCG) to provide humanitarian assistance in Cox's Bazar. With the emerging challenges due to COVID-19, DRC successfully managed to provide emergency assistance and support to both communities to build capacity, resilience, and strength to fight this global pandemic.
