The Free 2 Link project aims to strengthen the ability of frontline staff who work with victims of trafficking in the field and professionals working in asylum systems and integration programmes. The project activities span across Italy, Greece, and other European routes for trafficking of women, with the aim to early identify victims of e-trafficking, both in public and private networks.

### Project activities

Through the F2L project the NGO partners will:

- Engage with relevant public authorities will engage in research activities and workshops to develop up to date knowledge on the topic of women e-trafficking.
- Build an online platform on e-trafficking in multiple languages, accessible by staff and stakeholders.
- Train frontline staff in the public and private actors (including local authorities and law enforcement officials) on the use of the platform through face-to-face courses and e learning modules.
- Raise-awareness around e-trafficking, the highlights, key results, and outcomes of the project in the countries of origin with relevant professionals and representatives across EU countries of destination.

### DRC Greece takes part in the F2L project by:

- Contributing to research on the phenomenon of e-trafficking and producing a report on the state of the phenomenon in Greece.
- Contributing to raise-awareness and dissemination activities around e-trafficking and the outcomes of the project in Greece and in Europe.
