

## Rural Resilience and Integration of Agropastoral Producers in the most Productive Sectors of the Northern Prefectures of CAR

### CONTEXT

The security crisis that has affected the Central African Republic since 2013 has had the following effects on the agropastoral capabilities of northern prefectures:

- Socio-economic difficulties do not allow to efficiently and sustainably exploit agropastoral resources;
- High crop destruction and low crop production;
- Under-investment in the agropastoral sector coupled with regular destructuring;
- Low development of the agropastoral sectors;
- Mostly subsistence family production with low income generation.

### PROJECT OBJECTIVE

The objective of the program is to contribute to the resilience of agropastoral stakeholders of the northern prefectures of CAR. This will be achieved through the reinforcement of their capabilities so they can equitably and sustainably integrate promising sectors and markets, and through the implementation of collective actions.

**Result 1** : Stakeholders in the agropastoral sector have access to services, inputs, equipment and infrastructure adapted to individual and collective needs for the sustainable integration of promising and emerging agropastoral sectors

**Result 2** : The transfer of skills and local support for targeted stakeholders allow local producers to integrate sectors and markets

**Result 3** : Transhumance-related tensions and insecurity are mitigated through awareness and better access to local mechanisms for peaceful conflict resolution

## BENEFICIARIES

73,040 direct beneficiaries will benefit from the action including members of takeover bids, groups, individual agropastoral producers, Local Economic Actors, members of Interest Economic Groups and State and Parastatal Proximity Actors.
